The Safer Renfrewshire Partnership

The Safer Renfrewshire Partnership is made up of the main local public sector organisations that have responsibilities for keeping our communities safe. These include:

- Renfrewshire Council
- Strathclyde Police
- Strathclyde Fire & Rescue
- Renfrewshire Community Health Partnership
- The Children's Reporter
- The Procurator Fiscal
- Local voluntary organisations

These organisations are committed to working together through community planning to make Renfrewshire a safer place to live in, work in and visit.

The Safer Renfrewshire Partnership will focus on seven key aims to improve community safety over the next three years:

1. Reduce violence in our communities and town centres
2. Increase reporting of domestic abuse
3. Reduce antisocial behaviour
4. Reduce injuries and deaths due to accidents in the home
5. Reduce injuries and deaths due to road collisions
6. Reduce the harm caused by illegal drug activity
7. Reduce alcohol-related crime and disorder and under-age drinking

Safer and stronger communities

This booklet contains information on local services that can help if you have concerns about your own personal safety or the safety of your community.

An important factor in how safe our communities are is how well they are able to deal with their own problems and take action to improve the lives of their residents. Communities can strengthen their ability to do this by working in partnership with local agencies such as the Council, the police and the health service.

The second part of this booklet recognises this important link between safe communities and strong communities by providing details of help and resources that local public agencies can offer community and voluntary groups.

Antisocial Behaviour

ASIST and Mediation teams

The Council's Antisocial Behaviour Investigation Team (ASIST) and its Mediation Services are available to help all Renfrewshire residents who have problems with:

- Noise nuisance
- Neighbour disputes
- Threatening or intimidating behaviour
- Youth disorder

Clean Renfrewshire

The Clean Renfrewshire campaign encourages everyone in Renfrewshire to do their bit to tackle environmental problems like litter, graffiti, fly-tipping and dog fouling. The Council can support local groups by providing resources such as clean-up equipment and helping with fundraising.

Renfrewshire Wardens Service

The Renfrewshire Wardens support the Clean Renfrewshire campaign by enforcing anti-litter laws. They have powers to issue fixed penalty notices for littering, dog fouling and breaching the smoking ban.

The wardens can also deal with minor complaints of antisocial behaviour such as vandalism, noise nuisance and youth disorder. The wardens service operates from 7am-10pm daily.

Domestic Noise

If you have a problem with noisy neighbours, you can contact the Council's Noise Enforcement team. An officer will investigate your complaint and, if the noise is caused by antisocial behaviour and exceeds permitted levels, the perpetrator may be issued with a warning notice under the Antisocial Behaviour (Scotland) Act 2004. Failure to comply with a warning notice may result in a £100 fixed penalty notice being issued.

Community Police Officers

Community police officers have responsibilities for specific areas of Renfrewshire (these mirror Renfrewshire Council wards).

Part of the officers' job is to get close to the areas they are working in – by attending community council meetings, visiting community centres, meeting with councillors and building links with schools, churches and other groups and individuals.

By getting to know their communities and working closely with residents and public agencies, community police officers can resolve crime and antisocial behaviour problems at an early stage.

Care & Repair Renfrewshire

Care & Repair carry out small maintenance jobs such as fitting or repairing locks and window catches. The service is available free of charge to all Renfrewshire residents who are aged 60 or over or who have a disability. Jobs that they can carry out include:

- Fitting security chains, peepholes and identi-slots
- Installing battery-operated smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors
- Fitting key safes
- Fitting additional locks and other security measures

Drug and alcohol misuse - Young people's services

The Council's addiction service provide young people with information and help on alcohol and substance misuse.

The service works with young people aged 12 – 21 who have problems with alcohol or substance misuse. They also work with young people who are involved or at risk of becoming involved in antisocial behaviour as a result of these issues.

It also offers support and guidance to young people whose parents have a problem with alcohol.

You can contact this service if you have concerns about a young person that you know. All we ask is that you make them aware that you are contacting the service and they are willing to meet service staff to discuss their problem.

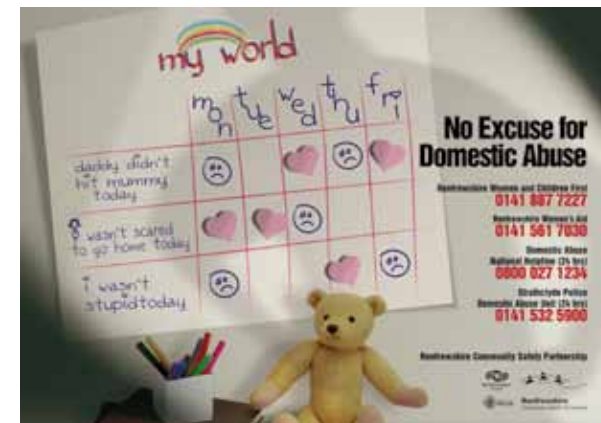

Community Learning and Development service

PPRC (Paisley Partnership Regeneration Company)

PPRC's Community Action Programme provides support to local groups to enable them to tackle issues of concern to their own communities.

The programme offers a range of accredited and non-accredited training courses customised for community group members. These include:

- Help with applying for external funding for community activities.
- Help and advice on getting involved in the community planning process through Local Area Committees (LACs). PPRC can assist community groups to apply for funding from LACs and other sources and provide support and advice to community representatives who are interested in the work of LACs.
- **Information sessions:**
PPRC can run support and advice sessions with community groups to help them develop, get access to funding, and take part in community planning.
- **Community Events:**
PPRC can provide support for community-led events such as gala days and local festivals.
